• Presentation Mode hides any guide lines made showing what the page will look like.

• Zoom In moves you closer into the Artboard. Zoom Out expands your view of the Artboard.

• Fit Artboard in Window will increase or decrease the view of your selected Artboard to fit to the size of your Illustrator window. Fit All in Window will adjust the view so all Artboards are visible in the window.

• Smart Guides, when checked, will automatically appear to help center and align objects.

• When first setting up a file, always show rulers in order to use the Guides. Rulers will appear left and top.

• Guides are lines pulled from the rulers by clicking, holding down the mouse, and dragging.

• Show Grid creates a grid on your document. Snap to Grid aligns objects to the grid.

• Snap to Point will align two points of different objects.
