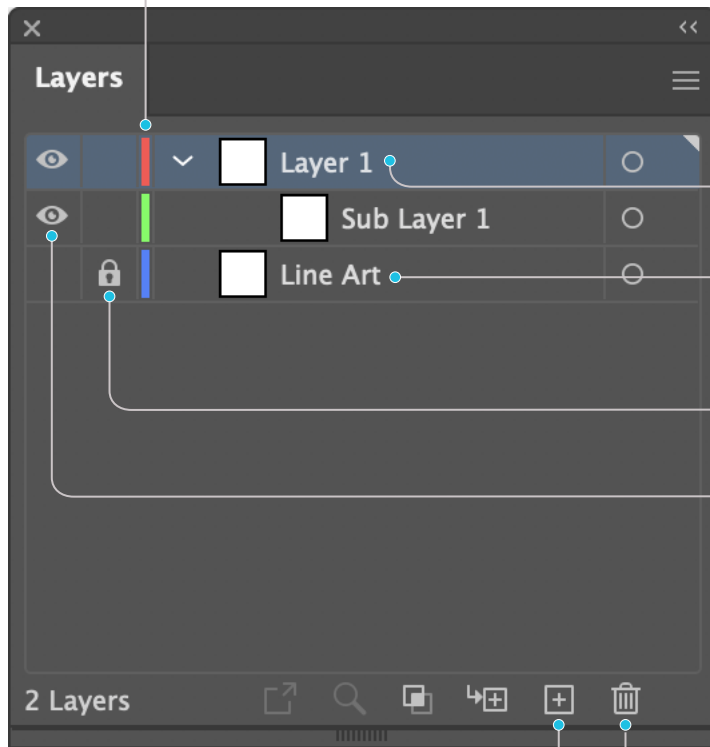


Layers



The colored bars indicate the color of selected items in a Layer. It helps keep track of which Layer is selected.

All objects in Illustrator exist on a Layer. Each time an object or stroke is made, it creates a Sub Layer within a Layer. When a Layer is a blue, that means that Layer is currently selected. Only objects on the selected Layer can be manipulated. You can move objects between Layers by dragging them into different Layers.

Layers can be renamed. It helps find certain Layers where you may wish to lock and unlock objects. Click twice with the Black Arrow to select the name.

The Lock Icon signifies that the Layer is locked. A locked Layer cannot be manipulated and objects on that Layer are unable to be selected. A pencil with a circle and slash will appear when you try to work in a locked layer

The eye toggles to show or hide a Layer. If the eye is hidden the Layer will also be hidden.

Select a Layer and then click the Trashcan to delete that Layer. You can also drag and drop a Layer into the Trashcan

Create New Layer places an new empty Layer above the current selected Layer.
